Indoor Window Watcher 	Strictly indoor, never comes into contact with other cats; sits in the window for hours at a time	Required: Feline Herpesvirus, Calicivirus, Panleukopenia, Rabies	PUREVAX Feline 3 PUREVAX Feline Rabies

COMPLETE FELINE WELLNESS: Annual physical exam for all classifications that includes dental evaluation, fecal exam, heartworm test, flea and tick checkup, appropriate blood tests depending on cat's age and geographic location

FELINE VACCINATION PROTOCOL SHEET

“Core” Vaccines are those which are recommended by AAFP for all kittens and cats against diseases of significant morbidity and mortality and wide geographic distribution.³

“Non-Core” Vaccines are those which are recommended by AAFP for all kittens and cats in special circumstances, dependent on the exposure risk of an individual animal against diseases that are generally self-limiting or readily responsive to treatment.³
