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Surgery Prep Form

~Your pet is currently scheduled for a surgical procedure with our hospital. This will require some significant before and after care that we want you to be prepared for.

~Prior to surgery, your pet will need to be fasted for at least 12 hours. This means NO FOOD after 7 pm the night before surgery. Water is ok to give until you arrive at the hospital.

~You will need to bring your pet in between 8:30 - 9:00 am the morning of the scheduled surgery. At this time, you will need to read and sign our surgical consent forms and pre-anesthetic bloodwork form.

~The surgical procedure will be completed that morning and you will be called as soon as your pet has recovered from anesthesia. You will be given a pick-up time during this phone call.

All canine patients and indoor cats (at owners request) will receive a complimentary nail trim at the time of surgery

~We will send all our surgery patients' home with an E-Collar (cone, lamp shade, ect). This will need to stay on AT ALL TIMES to prevent licking and chewing. The Doctor will let you know when it is no longer required. This will be harder on you than your pet but plays a big roll in the quick and smooth recovery of the patient. Do not let other pets in the house lick at the incision either!

~Your pet will need to stay confined and all activity restricted until the sutures are removed. This means going outside on a leash and only to go to the bathroom. No running, playing or running up and down the steps. They might need to be confined to a kennel or small room while you are not there to watch them. This is very important for your pet's health and recovery!

~Depending on the type of surgery performed, your pet may need to come in daily or every few days for bandage changes. This will be included in the cost of the surgery. The bandage changes will need to be at scheduled times and can last up to 14 days.

~The care given to your pet after surgery can make all the difference in the recovery process. Please make sure you follow these guidelines very closely and are prepared for all post-op care before your pets' surgical procedure.
